The Key Spouse Program is a formal program that offers informal peer-to-peer/Wingman support to spouses and family members. This program was developed as a Quality of Life Initiative out of concern for the Air Force Families. The Key Spouse or Key Spouse Mentor is a conduit for base and community information and programs that help families deal with military lifecycle challenges



What Key Spouses and Key Spouse Mentors are and what they provide...

- A conduit of information from the unit, base and local community
- Establish contact with all unit families, incoming unit members and deployed family members
- Volunteers, chosen and interviewed by the Unit Commander
- An official representative of the Unit
- Trained annually by the Airman & Family Readiness Center
- Work directly with the Unit Commander and First Sergeant
- Visible, Active and Available for the Air Force Community
- Spousal and Family Support System; Liaisons
- Troubleshoot issues and reports back to families or the unit leadership team
- Prepare and support families during separations
- Increase unit support and sense of community
- Improve quality of life amongst the Air Force Community
